IF YOU COULD CHANGE ONE THING ABOUT THE EQUINE INDUSTRY, WHAT WOULD IT BE?

Openness and truthfulness to what we are actually doing. I would like us all to see the equine industry through a different lense. We need to see our role, what we do and the equine world as it is seen by the wider public. Our practices need to be ethical, sustainable and horse welfare centred for the industry to survive and thrive.

HOW WOULD YOU IMPROVE EQUINE WELFARE?

Equine welfare will be improved by educating people and being able to give universal access to information that is based on research and logic.

WHAT EXCITING PROJECTS ARE YOU WORKING ON NOW?

In the background we are working on a media platform that will give people in the equine industry across the world access equine centred welfare based training. People need to be able to access evidence based training principles with coaches who really understand the underlying principles of horse behaviour and training welfare!!

WHAT DOES THE FUTURE HOLD, AND WHAT ARE YOUR NEXT GOALS?

My goal is to change the pathway the industry is currently taking. We need a dramatic change and we are focused on being leaders of a movement that will guarantee the future of the equine industry by inspiring a new generation of horse centred, welfare centred coaches.
